Two others are working on permits and erosion control permits and he just received another permit today. Conesus Golf Club got their approval to subdivide The Barns which is for sale. There are a couple other two-lot subdivisions going on. The DEC put a stop work order on the two new builds down on East Lake Rd. at the gravel pit. The DEC is requesting they each complete a SWIT permit.

They are wondering what the Eagle Scout Project cost, other upcoming projects will cost, how much do we have all together? Livingston County Board of Supervisor is running smoothly. They are hopeful they have reached an agreement with Empire Access for the new Broadband project. Livingston County's goal is that every single resident will have access to Broadband internet. It's a 4 year project.

While Conesus fared a bit better than towns north of here with the recent storms, there was a plugged culvert on East Lake Rd.
